I am a doctoral candidate in Curriculum and Instruction (English Education) here at the University of Texas at Austin. In the next ten months, I hope to complete a dissertation entitled "Stimulating Rhetorical Invention in English Composition through Computer-Assisted Instruction (CAI)." Without the cooperation of the Freshman English Policy Committee, the English faculty, and, of course, the students enrolled in your program, such a research project would be impossible to complete.

Consequently, I respectfully request permission to:

- (1) Select three instructor volunteers and three student volunteers from English 306 in the late fall to assist in the second validation of the CAI modules;
