Dear Paul:

The legislation, "Proposal by the General Faculty for an Undergraduate University Requirement in English" (D&M 14189-14193), is hereby approved except for the section that authorizes the University Council to approve substitutes for English 346K. I am asking the Deans of the Schools and Colleges to incorporate these three English courses into their degree programs as a component of their compliance with the Writing section of the Basic Education Requirements. If experience with these new requirements suggests it would be appropriate to reconsider the possibility of authorizing substitutes for English 346K, new legislation should be submitted to the University Council.
