The E. 346 Committee has asked me to submit to the Senate for its approval a Business variant of E. 346K. The Committee unanimously approved this variant at a recent meeting. It would be based on the same principles as the other three variants, and I enclose the general course description we approved.

E 346K: Writing in Different Disciplines

An upper-division course in English composition, with emphasis on writing and reading within the general area of one of the following topics:

- (1) Arts and Humanities
- (2) Social and Behavioral Sciences
- (3) Natural Sciences and Technology
- [(4) Business]

Readings include essays relating to the area and to the intellectual implications of the disciplines concerned. Discussions include analyses of different viewpoints regarding similar subject matter and of the different forms of writing that result.

Expository writing appropriate to the area: approximately six papers, chiefly analytical. Writing assignments may include research term papers, reports, exercises, and other kinds of writing. The aim is to develop general writing skills in expository prose directed to the educated nonspecialist. Students from any college MM may enroll in any section of E 346K.
