

E 346K Writing in Different Disciplines: Arts and Humanities, Staff

1. An upper-division course in English composition, with emphasis on writing and reading within the general area of Arts and Humanities. Readings include essays relating to the area and to the intellectual implications of the disciplines concerned. Discussions include analyses of different viewpoints regarding similar subject matter and of the different forms of writing that result.
2. Comley, et al.: *Fields of Writing* Dornan and Dawe: *The Brief English Handbook*. Additional texts may be assigned by individual instructors.
3. Expository writing appropriate to the area: approximately six papers, chiefly analytical. Writing assignments may include research term papers, reports, exercises, and other kinds of writing. The aim is to develop general writing skills in expository prose directed to the educated nonspecialist.
